Private Educational Psychologist Reports & Medical Letters We are seeing an increase in the number of students being assessed by private educational psychologists and submitting the reports to the SENCO as evidence that their child should be awarded Examination Access Arrangements. Private educational psychologist's reports cost a significant amount of money. This therefore means that parents who are unable to obtain a private report through their financial circumstances are put at a disadvantage. As an exam centre we must be consistent in our decisions and ensure that no student is 'either given an unfair advantage or be disadvantaged by any arrangements put in place'. Often private educational psychologists, recommend that children should receive EAA which can be in conflict with what the SENCO or centre tester (Specialist Assessor) recommends and can also be in conflict with the current JCQ regulations. Similarly, Medical letters from a health professional can help to provide an evidence of need for a student, but a note from a medical professional does not mean an automatic entitlement to EAA.

Evidence of need and normal way of working In order to award Examination Access Arrangements, The Oakes College Cambridge is required to show that you have a clear evidence of need and that the Access Arrangement you are applying for is your normal way of working. Such evidence could include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Unfinished mock examinations • Other unfinished timed assessments, such as internal tests • An individual education plan or learning plan • A compilation of observations or comments from teaching staff.
